Photoshop also supports custom brushes, enabling me to develop a personal style and create detailed elements like hair, textures, lighting, and shadows.

- **Using Layers in Illustration:**

Layers are a key feature that greatly enhances flexibility in the illustration process. By separating elements such as background, characters, colors, and lighting into different layers, I can easily edit specific parts without affecting the overall artwork. This method improves efficiency and helps maintain consistency throughout the creative process.

- **Editing and Applying Effects:**

Photoshop offers various effects such as Gaussian Blur, Drop Shadow, Outer Glow, and texture overlays. These tools are useful for creating depth, enhancing lighting, and adding realistic surface details, making the illustrations more vivid and visually engaging.

CHAPTER 2. CONTENT

2.1. TOPIC OVERVIEW

With the goal of completing the illustrated artbook based on “The Marriage of Sir Gawain”, I aim to apply the knowledge and skills I have accumulated throughout my studies to create a work that reflects my personal artistic voice. This artbook is not only a graduation project but also an opportunity for me to reinterpret a classic Arthurian tale through illustration, giving it new visual life while preserving its core humanistic values.

The characters in the artbook are developed based on the original literary descriptions, combined with my own creative interpretation. Gawain, the central character, is portrayed as a noble knight whose inner conflicts, moral growth, and emotional transformation play a crucial role in the story. Through character design, facial expressions, gestures, and costumes inspired by medieval European aesthetics, I aim to convey the psychological depth and humanity of each character.

The background and setting are inspired by medieval Europe, particularly the Arthurian world. Elements such as castles, royal courts, forests, and rural landscapes are illustrated to reflect the atmosphere of the Middle Ages, while still allowing room for modern creative adaptation. - Printing and Publishing

2.2.1. Defining Theme and Concept

2.2.1.1. Defining Theme

- Main theme:

The illustrated artbook “*The Marriage of Sir Gawain*” focuses on visually interpreting the short story through illustration in order to convey its humanistic values and moral messages. By combining narrative and imagery, the project aims to evoke emotional engagement and provide viewers with a deeper understanding of themes such as love, respect, and the role of women in medieval society.

- Core idea:

- Main character: Gawain is portrayed based on the original Arthurian text as a noble knight who undergoes moral and emotional challenges. His character development reflects the journey toward understanding respect, integrity, and equality within marriage.
- Setting: The visual setting is inspired by medieval Europe, particularly the Arthurian world, including King Arthur's court, castles, forests, and mythical landscapes characteristic of medieval legends.
- Story: The illustrations focus on key moments of “*The Marriage of Sir Gawain*”, highlighting themes of honor, promises, love, and mutual respect between individuals.
- Illustration style: The art style draws inspiration from medieval European aesthetics, combined with modern creative elements. A muted and warm color palette is used to enhance the legendary atmosphere and emotional depth of the story.

- Theme objectives:

- Conveying Humanistic Messages: Emphasizing values such as understanding, respect, and equality in relationships, especially within marriage.

- Evoking Emotional Reflection: Encouraging viewers to reflect on the psychological depth of the characters and the timeless moral lessons of the story.
- Honoring Classical Literature: Contributing to the preservation and reinterpretation of Arthurian legends through contemporary illustration, making the work more accessible to modern audiences.

2.2.1.2. *Concept*

The illustrated artbook “*The Marriage of Sir Gawain*” is structured into two main parts: the opening at King Arthur’s court and the challenge that initiates the story, followed by Gawain’s journey, marriage, and moral resolution. Characters are depicted with varied expressions and body language, combined with symbolic medieval European settings. The illustrations are arranged in narrative order to guide viewers from initial conflict to the story’s humanistic message.

2.2.2. *Researching and Planning*

- **Finding Artistic Inspiration:**
Analyze existing illustrated books and artworks inspired by medieval legends and mythology to learn about composition, color schemes, and emotional storytelling through images. Explore illustration styles that balance classical medieval aesthetics with modern creative approaches.
- **Audience Analysis:**
 - Primary audience: Readers and art enthusiasts interested in illustrated literature and medieval legends.
 - Secondary audience: Students, researchers, and general readers who seek visual interpretations of classic literary works.

2.2.2.2. *Planning*

- **Building content:**
 - Main story: The artbook is developed based on the short story “*The Marriage of Sir Gawain*”, centering on King Arthur’s crisis, Sir Gawain’s noble sacrifice, and the story’s profound message about women’s autonomy and respect within marriage.
 - Introduction: Presents the conflict in which King Arthur is captured by a powerful baron and is forced to answer a life-or-death riddle: “*What do women truly desire?*”

- Body: Illustrates Arthur's journey to seek the answer, his encounter with an old woman, and Sir Gawain's selfless decision to marry her in order to save the king and the kingdom. The focus is placed on Gawain's moral integrity, emotional growth, and honorable character.
- Conclusion: Concludes with the resolution of the riddle - the right of women to make their own choices - and the transformation of the old woman, emphasizing themes of mutual respect, understanding, and genuine love in marriage.
- Outline layout:
- Cover page: Includes the publisher's name and logo, the title of the story, images of the main character, price, barcode, target audience, and message.
- Content pages: Story progression / plot development.
- Credits page: This page lists the author, illustrator, editor, cover designer, publisher, year of publication, etc.
- Prepare resources:
- Illustration tools:
 - Use XP-Pen drawing tablet to ensure accuracy and naturalness when sketching and drawing details.
 - Adobe Photoshop for drawing and editing illustrations, focusing on light, shadow and color.
- Collecting materials:
 - Search for and store reference images of the medieval period, including architecture and clothing from that era.
 - Refer to other illustrations to learn about drawing style, color combinations and storytelling.
- Color research:

Create a color palette suitable for the theme: use warm tones (yellow, orange, red) for interiors to evoke a sense of antiquity, combined with blue and green to create contrast and a fresh feeling.

3.1. Creating Sketching Design Ideas

3.1.1. *Character sketching:*




Image 5 – Sketch page 1 2




Image 6 – Sketch page 3 4




Image 7 – Sketch page 5 6




Image 9 - Sketch page 9 10




Image 10 - Sketch page 11 12




Image 11 - Sketch page 13 14




Image 12 - Sketch page 15 16




Image 15 - Sketch page 21 22















- Print Experience: My practical experience with printing materials, paper selection, and finishing techniques remains limited, affecting the final physical presentation of the illustrated book.
- Visual Experimentation: Some illustrations remain within a relatively safe visual approach, and bolder experimentation in composition and lighting could further enhance emotional impact.

In conclusion, this graduation project has significantly contributed to my growth as an illustrator. It not only strengthened my technical and creative abilities but also highlighted areas for future improvement, serving as a strong foundation for my professional development.

2. Recommendations

To improve the quality and effectiveness of future graduation projects, I would like to propose the following recommendations:

- For the University and Department:
 - Organize more specialized workshops and seminars focusing on illustration, visual storytelling, and book design to help students better understand industry practices.
 - Encourage collaboration with publishers or creative studios to provide students with real-world illustration and publishing experience.
- Personal Development Plan:
 - Continuously refine my illustration skills and explore diverse art styles to expand my creative range.
 - Improve foreign language proficiency to access international literature, references, and global illustration trends.
 - Gain deeper knowledge of printing techniques and book production to ensure higher-quality illustrated publications in future projects.

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
